Q1: How do you stay attentive in classes, Tshering Choezom?

Answer: Paying attention in class is my priority because it's the foundation of understanding. During theory classes, I focus entirely on what the teacher is explaining. To ensure I don't forget important details, I take short but meaningful notes. These notes serve as my guide for later revisions. Staying attentive not only helps me grasp concepts more effectively, but it also reduces the burden of learning everything from scratch at home.

Elaboration for inspiration: Revising the same day ensures that the content is fresh in your mind and becomes part of your long-term memory. Make it a daily habit—it's like exercising for your brain. A little effort every day prevents last-minute stress before exams.

Q3: How do you address doubts or unclear topics?

Answer: If a topic is unclear to me, I don't let it slide. I go back to my notes and read them thoroughly, sometimes multiple times. Additionally, I use the internet as a resource to explore different explanations and clarify my doubts.

Elaboration for inspiration: Never shy away from your doubts. They are a natural part of learning. With so many resources available today—teachers, peers, books, and online platforms—you have no reason to remain confused about any topic. Persistence is key!



Q4: What advice would you give to students to avoid falling behind in studies?

Answer: The most crucial thing is to always complete your notes and homework on time. This practice keeps you aligned with what is being taught in school and ensures that you don't fall behind. Procrastination is your biggest enemy. Avoid delaying your tasks because piling them up will only add unnecessary stress.

Elaboration for inspiration: Successful students like Tshering Choezom are proof that discipline and consistency lead to excellence. Develop a routine where every day's work is completed within that day. Small, consistent efforts are more effective than last-minute cramming.

Q5: How do you motivate yourself to maintain this level of commitment?

Answer: I remind myself of my goals and the bigger picture. I think about how my efforts today will shape my future. Staying organized and being accountable for my studies make me feel in control of my journey.

Elaboration for inspiration: Motivation comes from setting clear goals and celebrating small achievements. Visualize the future you want and remind yourself daily that every step you take brings you closer to that dream. Discipline is the bridge between dreams and success.
