The match, held at Sherubtse Stadium, was attended by a lively crowd eager to witness the clash between the two football powerhouses.

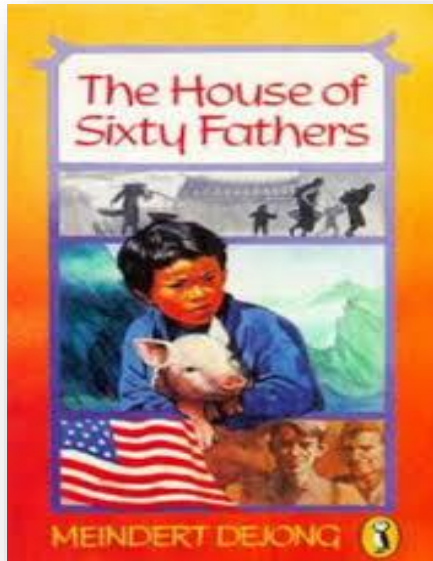
Infinite Love

“The House of Sixty Fathers”

He was born on March 4, 1906 in Wierum, Friesland, Netherlands. He died on July 16, 1991 at the age of 85 at Michigan, US.

The House of Sixty Fathers received the Josette Frank Award (then named the children's Book Award of the child study Association) in 1956. It was a Newbery runner-up in 1957.

Review of Book:

When Japanese soldiers burn Tien Pao's village, his family escapes to Hengyang, China, on a small boat called a Sampan.

Tien Pao's parents look for work at an American military airfield. They take Tien Pao's baby sister and tell him to stay on

the boat until his parents return. The Tien Pao rest the next day, the boat loss and carries him back into enemy territory. He awakes in terror and prays to the river god for help. His only comfort on the stormy water is the family's pig, which he names Beauty-of-the-Republic after his sister. One day, Tien Pao happen to see the Japanese shoot down an American plane and he tries to help wounded airman escape and cares the man as they slowly hike out of the danger zone. A group of Chinese finds Tien Pao just before he blacks out from hunger and takes him to their barracks, where sixty soldiers reside. They ask the boy to tell his story and was excited to learn that he saved their squadron leader, Lieutenant Hamsun. As the all the sixty soldiers dotes him and the Chinese interpreter calls them Tien Pao's sixty fathers. When the Lieutenant recovers and return to the base, he and Tien happen to enjoy their reunion. Lt.Hamsun helped the boy find his family by flying over the plane through the crowds. At last Tien Pao sees his mother at the airfield and reunited with his family.

Theme:

- The House of Sixty Fathers tells or talks about the hope, kindness of strangers and good judgement to strangers.
